## TTARP GAINS TWO MAJOR BENEFITS FOR SENIORS IN 2018/2019 BUDGET BY Cecil Paul - National Issues Chairman, TTARP

Cvery year TTARP submit proposals to our Government Con measures to improve the living standards and welfare, not just for our members but for all Senior Citizens. Since our formation many of the proposals made for Seniors were implemented due to the very strength and respect of our organization, being the largest Non-Governmental Organization in our country. Much more can be gained for seniors as we grow in numbers, hence the importance of persons age 50 and over becoming members.

In the 2018/2019 Budget the honourable Minister of Finance announced the implementation of two measures for seniors for which TTARP has been proposing for many vears.

(1) Many of our members who are retired Public Servants have had to wait for as long as two years for their Pensions as the process to track their work history in the Government Service is lengthy, this cause severe hardships, since they have to survive on just their National Insurance System (NIS) Pensions until their records are processed.

As announced in the budget, public servants will now receive an interim pension of three thousand dollars (\$3,000), while their work records are processed, after which they will receive their arrears (back pay) and their correct pension implemented. This is a major relief for public officers who performed critical services for the national community.

(2) The Senior Citizens Grant payable at age sixty five was only available to persons who earned a combined monthly income of less than \$5,000. This combined monthly income included NIS pension and any other Occupational Pension. So for example, someone receiving an NIS pension of \$3,000 plus Occupational Pension of \$2,000 will NOT qualify for a Senior Citizens grant.

The Senior Citizens Grant has now been increased to \$6,000. Hence, those who previously did not qualify because of their combined, may now be able to receive a Grant.

## Breast Cancer and your treatment options in T&T

Breast cancer is the most common type of cancer in females in Trinidad and Tobago, the wider Caribbean and in almost all developed countries, with about 400 new cases per 100,000 women over 55 years old, every year!

Breast cancer treatment unfortunately is often a long and complex journey for the patient and typically consists of three modalities, namely the surgical operation, chemotherapy (and its variations) and a LONG course of Whole Breast Irradiation (WBI).

Over the last 2 decades, there has been a shift from mastectomy to Breast Conserving Surgery (or BCS) and **BCS** is now considered the standard surgical operation in developed jurisdictions, with mastectomy reserved for special situations; for e.g. large cancers occurring in small



those cases. chemotherapy and the long course of WBI is still required. WBI means daily visits for 4 to 6 weeks to a radiotherapy center. Complications are not infrequent and its very expensive. Logistically

#### So, what is the Alternative to five weeks of conventional radiation, that almost all breast cancer patients currently have to endure?

The new technological improvement in current radiation practice, comes in the form of Intra-Operative Radio Therapy (IORT) also known as Electronic Brachytherapy. This modality has been utilized in health institutions throughout the world for more than a decade (including the USA, Europe and Australia) and is applicable for a significant proportion of early breast cancers. Presently many breast cancer patients in T&T may be receiving unnecessary **WBI**, the usual five-week course.

This innovative form of **IORT** replaces **WBI** with 10 to 15 minutes of low voltage radiation given during the surgical removal of the breast cancer (lumpectomy)! When you awake from the anesthesia, your radiotherapy would be

all done! In about 10 to 15 per cent of patients however, a short course of WBI will still be needed.

**IORT** is both immediate and accurate and the same cannot be said for conventional WBI. Although WBI has improved over time,

it still takes weeks to deliver with timeconsuming visits to the Radiation

centers. The

advantages



are numerous and besides being cheaper, safer and much more convenient for patient and family, it has been shown to have the SAME clinical outcomes (results) as conventional radiotherapy with respect to recurrence and survival.

Patients however, must have the tumor and demographic criteria (characteristics) suitable for **IORT** and ideally, they should have early stage breast cancers, among other characteristics to be determined by the surgeon and oncologist. So, it is important to be aware that not all patients are suitable for **IORT**.

Women today are much more aware of breast cancer and are conscious that they must do regular breast self-examinations. They have easy access to screening mammograms, and fortunately now, they are detecting their cancers earlier, which would make treatment using **IORT**. much more likely. This trend is already seen in 1st world countries.

#### Is IORT available in the Caribbean?

#### **One and Done**

In recent years, advances in the detection and treatment of breast cancer have enabled the use of less invasive treatment options with benefits such as breast conservation. ## Cuba Cetaway 2018

In July, a small group of thirty TTARP members left for one of the most historical and mysterious Caribbean countries, Cuba. From the airport, we took a two and a half-hour (but it did not seem that long) very scenic and country drive to the All-inclusive Resort, La Catus in Varadero.

## FANTASTIC CHINA 2018 by Mayling Younglao

In October, forty four **TTARP** members left Trinidad bound for China via the City of New York. We spent one night in the Big Apple and boarded Air China the very next day to China. We were all prepared for the long 13 hour flight, during which time members got up every two to three hours to walk the aisles, stretch, chat and just "lime" to pass the time.

Our first entrance into China was in Beijing, where we meet our Tour Guide Hoi. Hoi is the most connected, efficient, and humorous person who has an excellent command of the English Language. Recognising me as the group leader, he immediately pulled me aside and assured me that he is now in charge, and that we are in good hands since he boasted that he was great at his job and has been doing so for 20 years.

I am in China so "ah taking buff". What Hoi did not know is that a Trini doesn't "fight for wok", so I was only too happy to relinguish my tasks. And

what a fabulous job he did !! He took us through the various tours using two apparatus, one was his green florescent bag pack which he assured us was the only one in the whole of China, the second was his whispers, which was a device with head phones. We were each told very sternly that "if you are not hearing my voice" you are out of range so get yourselves back in range." It worked .... no one got lost or strayed away, a rare achievement in group tours.

#### Beijing

We visited the Tiananmen Square the largest Square in the world, The Forbidden City, the former seat of the emperors of the Ming and Qing dynasties that is now the home of the National Palace Museum and The Summer Palace ,that was the Royal retreat. We took a scenic Boat Ride on the Kunming Lake. We climbed the The Great Wall which is over 4000 miles - I made it to Level 3, but at least twenty members, all with various knees, back and even heart issues made it to Level 8. I am particularly

proud of Heather Arthur, who showed that with determination one can achieve what doctors and advisers say is impossible. Two other members Rawle Sylvester and Leroy Guy made it to the 12th Level. Next we visited the Ming Tombs which is the burial site of 13 Emperors. We were given a view of how the Chinese lived for centuries in ancient narrow back alleys (Hutong). This tour was done by rickshaws with each holding only 4 persons. What a pretty picture we made with a dozen red rickshaws going through the alleys. We were even invited to the home of a local family for lunch.

Added to the above tours we had the famous Peking Duck Dinner and a fabulous "Legend of Kung Fu" show at the Red Theatre. Quite memorable in Beijing for me, was the six Herbal Doctors who made very accurate medical diagnosis from simply observing and slight touches without speaking one word of English. Amazing ! We were all then pampered with foot massages and some of

us(me) were also lucky to get a back massage also.

#### Xian

Our tour continued to Xian via Air China, which was a two hour flight from Beijing. Hoi, our tour guide, actually had our boarding passes waiting for us at the airport, this was well received and showed his connections. Much to our surprise and pleasure he stayed with us throughout the entire tour of the other Provinces. At our Hotel check in, all our rooms and keys were awaiting our arrival so that too was hassle-free. The Xian local guide was named Alli, and she took us first to one of the worlds' archaeological discoveries - Terra Cota Army buried with Emperor Qin that was discovered in 1974 after being buried for 22 centuries. This is one of the World Heritage sites, and it is totally Incredible .... Emperor Qin Shi requested that thousands of life size soldiers and horses with their armour be buried with him to safeguard him in the afterlife. This truly is a world wonder.

#### Shanghai

The best was left for last, Shanghai was definitely the WOW factor on the trip, the hotel with its huge inviting foyer, staircase and architectural design was astonishing. The welcome feast that awaited us upon arrival was well received by these weary travellers, but our day had just started. With very little time to freshen up we were off again on a boat ride that can eclipse the Thames of London, what a spectacle. This is indeed a modern City with all the glitz and glamour to boost our energy. We walked down the Bund, a long stretch of a paved walkway with its entire walls covered with live colourful flowers. On our

exit, as if to put China back in perspective we toured the very first Bank in Shanghai and marvelled at its structure and carvings.

I think a book would have to be written as space does not allow me the opportunity to write everything. From the fishing for my own oyster and discovering the pearls inside and learning now to recognise the genuine gem to seeing the live worms and their cocoon go through the various stages before one strand of silk thread is attained. Watching a live acrobatic show. Going through the canal, similar to the Gondola's of Paris and YES the Chinese were serenading us along . Attending the Tea market

## **CHAGUANAS ZONE** - Central Pride

### **History of Central Pride Zone** March 2003 to May 2018

A long-term working relationship led to the formation of TTARP Central, when some time after retirement, Mrs. Joyce Wong Sang, then Executive Board member of TTARP, approached Mr. Ramnath Ramcharitar for assistance in the formation of the Central Zone. TTARP (Central) saw its genesis at 29 Max Murphy Street, Chaguanas in the backyard of the late Mr. Abidh Hosein, our first Chairman. The initial stage was set in the company of Messrs. Iqubal Hydal, Silochan Bisnath, Dipchand Baldeo and Ramlal Rattansingh

The inaugural meeting took place on March 24, 2003 at Presentation College, Chaguanas, where the first executive was elected and then duly installed by Mrs. Joyce Wong Sang. That first executive comprised:

Despite the role played by Mr. Ramcharitar in the formation of the Zone, he did not accept office as he was heavily involved with his fledging business as a National Insurance Consultant.

During this early period, meetings were held at various venues including the then Chaguanas Junior Secondary School, Presentation College, the Central Indoor Sport Arena, the Catholic Family Centre and the homes of its members. This continued until 2006 when on the initiative of Mesdames Mairoon Ali and Rajwatti Bhaggan-Wegner, an application was successfully made to the then Ministry of Social Development to form the Chaguanas Senior Activity Centre. This marriage between TTARP Central and the Ministry, enabled the zone to find a convenient, centralized location at 41 Jasmine Avenue, Edinburgh Gardens, Chaguanas. The inaugural opening of the Centre by the then Hon Minister Anthony Roberts, was held on November 29, 2006. The Centre was officially

launched on March 1st 2007 by Dr. Jennifer Rouse, Director of Ageing of the Division of Ageing. This action opened the zone and enabled persons who were not TTARP Members to participate in activities from Mondays to Fridays from 9.00a.m to 3.00p.m. These activities comprised of Dancing, Aerobics, Yoga, Tai Chi, Singing and Computer studies.

The Centre was eventually closed in January 2017 in spite of TTARP's best efforts to keep it afloat, and the TTARP Zone reconvene its operation exclusively for TTARP Members in March 2017 at The Central Indoor Sport Arena in Chaguanas.

Over the years, Central Pride indulged in several field trips and hosted many seasonal activities and out-reach programmes ably led by Abid Hosein 2003-2006; Igubal Hydal 2006-2009; Rajwatti Bhaggan-Wegner 2010–2012; Janet Rawlins 2012–2017 and Faith Calliste 2017-. Present. These Chairpersons have been assisted by an Executive Zonal Board.

## HOME MADE **CHOW CHOW**



Recipe

The perfect topping for your Christmas ham, this chow chow is the ideal pairing. Pickle vegetables in a mustard base is the perfect holiday condiment.

There are some things that just need to be in your house at Christmas time. I guess we would call them Christmas staples? Without them, it wasn't really Christmas.

Chow chow is one of those staples. Is it possible to eat ham without chow chow? This is a must have on the breakfast table once ham is there. Ham sandwiches on Christmas morning needed to have fresh bread, fresh ham and a dollop of chow chow on it. Without it, it just wouldn't be right.

This recipe for making Chow Chow uses everyday vegetables that have been brined and then simmered in a mustard base giving you that perfect kick to top a variety of options.

I love being able to make my own chow chow so I'm able to use vegetables I love to eat, versus being stuck with the store brand of whatever they choose to throw in.

Chow chow is pickled vegetables in a sauce. Why is it called chow chow I am not sure? I actually tried to research it but did not find anything.

This is the ultimate Caribbean Christmas condiment that is easily paired with a slice of ham. This pickle/relish can easily be used on meats for that added kick.

#### PREP TIME: 1 HOUR AND 25 MINSCOOK TIME: 30 MINSTOTAL TIME: 1 HOURS AND 55 MINS

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 2 large sweet peppers (one red, one green) chopped
- 1 cup chopped cauliflower
- 1 cup chopped sweet onion (or regular onion)
- 1 carrot, chopped
- 8 pimento peppers, chopped (optional)
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 5 tablespoons sugar
- 2 tablespoons turmeric powder
- 10 cloves
- 2 1/2 cups vinegar
- 2 1/2 tablespoons mustard
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- Water

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1. Make sure that all vegetables are cut to small, uniformed sizes
- 2. Cover with water and add salt and mix. Leave to sit in brine for at least an hour (or overnight)
- 3. In a deep pot add sugar, turmeric, cloves, vinegar, mustard and cornstarch
- 4. Whisk mixture till it starts to boil, trying to get rid of any lumps that may have formed
- 5. Lower stove to a simmer for about 10 minutes as vou continue to whisk
- 6. Strain mixture to get rid of cloves
- 7. Add back to pot on medium heat and drain vegetables of water used for brine
- 8. Add vegetables to mustard liquid and incorporate
- 9. Bring to a boil then lower to a simmer as mixture thickens up while randomly giving it a stir.
- 10. Once at a nice relish texture, remove from heat and store in an airtight, sterile jar.
