



TTARP BENEFITS

A. NATIONAL BENEFITS FOR PERSONS AGE 50+

TTARP negotiated /implemented for its Members a wide variety of discounts for purchases at numerous Commercial, Medical and Retail enterprises. These are being updated on an ongoing basis.

B. NATIONAL BENEFITS FOR PERSONS AGE 60+

The following are TTARP's Recommendations to the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago (GORTT) and others on behalf of <u>Senior Citizens</u> which are now in effect :-

- 1. Fee Exemption for the renewal of a Trinidad and Tobago Passport.
- 2. Fee Exemption for the renewal of a Trinidad and Tobago Driver's Permit.
- 3. Exemption from Trinidad and Tobago Airport Departure Tax on Airline Tickets
- 4. Tax Exemption on premium payments for General Insurance Policies (e.g. House and Car)
- 5. Free PTSC Bus Pass for bus rides in Trinidad and Tobago.
- 6. Free rides on the Water Taxi between POS and San Fernando.
- 7. Fee Exemption on certain bank services (e.g. Bank Drafts and bank statements for US Visas)
- 8. Preferential rates on fixed deposits at Banks and certain Credit Unions.
- 9. Increased the range of CDAP medications for ailments common to Senior Citizens.
- Extended Medical Care hours of services at community Centers from 7am to 4pm, to 7am to 7pm, and in certain areas from 7am to 10pm.
- The Senior Citizen Grant has been increased to \$3,500 (max) per month dependent on a means test for other Retirement Income from NIS and Occupational Pensions which must not exceed \$5,500 per month.
- 12. Retiring Government employees will now receive an interim pension of three thousand dollars (\$3,000), while their work records are processed, when verified, the retired employee will receive the correct pension and a lump sum for arrears.
- 13. Removal of semi-annual Life Certificate for NIS Pensioners.
- 14. Retired Government Pensioners will no longer be required to present themselves as proof of life existence as an online link will be established with the Registrar General's office.
- 15. Walk-Over constructed to assist senior citizens and others travelling to and from the Tobago Ferry Port and Water Taxi service.

OTHER

In context of approved GORTT National Budget 2022/2023 the following are some additional improvements which Senior Citizens (and Others) shall enjoy :-

- a) All first-time home owners will qualify for a tax-free allowance of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000).
- Employed persons will benefit from a personal tax deduction up to a maximum sum of \$60,000 on combined contributions to approved pension funds, annuity plans, and National Insurance.
- c) Value Added Tax (VAT) has been removed from many basic food items, such as biscuits, cooking oil, canned vegetables, canned meat and fish, cornflakes, curry, juice, sausages, ham, ketchup, pigtail, and bottled water.
- d) Electricity and Water rate rebates to be increased from 25% to 35% for bills LESS THAN Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00).
- e) Removal of VAT and Duties on therapy equipment for treatment of vision, hearing and physical disabilities.
- Removal of VAT and Import duties on computer equipment which should make these important communication devices cheaper.
- g) All Citizens will have access to Free WIFI internet connections at Transport Hubs, Public Hospitals, Schools and Libraries.
- h) Increase non-taxable Annual Income allowances to \$90,000 for all citizens.
- All taxes (including Customs Duty, Online Purchase Tax and Value Added Tax) on individual components in CCTV systems, including cameras and DVRs, are waived with effect from January 1st 2023.
- j) There is a collaboration between the Ministry of Social Development & Family Services, iGovTT and TTConnect to allow senior citizens to submit their Life Declaration Certificate Form by calling the toll free number 800-8826 for an appointment.



From growing and transforming institutions to motivating and empowering lives, his life's work has been intricately interwoven within the history-charting progress of Trinidad and Tobago. Testimony of this is his pioneering roles in carving the course of some of this country's leading institutions in the '70s, to penning world acclaimed motivational books at the turn of the century.

He didn't have any success manual back then. In maneuvering the challenging terrains which confronted his paths, he used lessons derived from his accomplishments in documenting success strategies: tactics extracted from rigorous preparation, hammered with commitment and sharpened with his most lethal weapon, sound character!

A successful son of our soil in business and respected internationally as a motivational author, Rochford's stellar contributions led to his 1975 award of the Humming Bird Medal (Gold) for Economics. As a Queen's Royal College (QRC) graduate, he whetted his feet a few years in the Public Service, serving in clerical positions at various Ministries. Beneficial experiences, but Rochford wanted more!

"I was always driven in improving my circumstances and during my earlier years I had a strong pull towards law and journalism," said Rochford, seated comfortably in his study at his Couva home. Law and journalism, however, were not on his cards. Destiny had a different calling.

In 1960, he commenced studies in money and

banking at the Oxford College of Technology, transferring to the University of Hull to study business economics. "I took every opportunity offered back then to deepen my knowledge and speed up my maturity," said Rochford.

This positive outlook worked well for him and returning home in 1964 plunged himself back into the Public Service as an economist assigned to the Ministry of Finance. His climb was rapid, being appointed Staff Assistant to the Minister of Finance and then Acting Senior Economist. The pivotal turning point was 1966. The doors of the Banking world swung open, landing him the position of Central Bank's Corporate Secretary.

"Foreign banks at that time did not allow locals to serve as Chief Executives in their home countries...however I decided to take a route for that position," said Rochford. With his focus firmly set on the prize, Rochford's banking career boomed! And with it came uninterrupted learnings

and exposure in monetary economics.

His Attorney-at-Law craving, however, did not diminish. In 1970, about to jet off to London to fulfil this dream, destiny again stepped in. He was approached to fill the Chief Executive position of the newly minted National Commercial Bank of Trinidad and Tobago (NCB). "While I wanted to be a barrister-at-law, I felt I had an obligation to rise to this occasion, as for the first time a son of the soil was being offered such an opportunity," said Rochford.

At that time seven international banks were registered to do business in T&T. None had a citizen as its helm. For Rochford, it was an opportunity to participate in the country's awakening of national self-confidence and establishing indigenous competence in finance and business.

With much excitement swirling around NCB's birth, Rochford held steadfast and measured. He knew the tall order that lay ahead. One he needed to conquer! "The challenge was debunking misconceptions that local citizens couldn't manage a commercial bank and establishing in people's minds that the bank was competent," said Rochford. And conquered he did!

With Rochford at the controls, the Bank introduced products and services which redounded to the improvement of the citizenry's lives and which saw a steady rise in market share. "I saw the wheels of the bank moving...we were causing a buzz," said Rochford who held the Bank's reigns as Executive Chairman and Chief Executive for 23 years, passing the baton on retirement at age 60.

While blazing his trail in banking, Rochford was again called upon to impart his business acumen with the establishment of two other national institutions. First was the newly established T&T National Petroleum Marketing Company Limited. As its non-executive Chairman, he oversaw placement of the marketing of the domestic petroleum products into local hands.

'All production were in the hands of international companies and the government held the view that the domestic marketing of products could be handled locally," said Rochford, adding that NP eventually acquired 100 percent market share. In 1979, he yet again accepted the challenge to integrate the international and domestic air services of T&T. He went on to develop a new vision for the airline and established an operational platform for success. **"These demonstrated at that time that locals were fully capable of handling their affairs,"** quipped Rochford.

Retirement, however, only signaled for Rochford the beginning of a new career.

"During my banking years, people would always need advice or in solving problems," said Rochford. It became clear then he needed to deal with people's attitudes and methods of thinking. It was this recognition that drove Rochford into Life Coaching, presenting practical avenues that will inspire people to claim better lives.

Rochford's focus shifted from Expanding Institutions to Empowering Lives.

His initial coaching formula took the form of newspaper articles, outlining success strategies. Buoyed by the vast positive feedback, he was drawn to recording his thoughts and experiences. In 2004, he commenced his first book Live a Life of "Virtual" Success.

"The underlying factor that prevents persons from reaching their full potential is the limitations they place on themselves," said Rochford, who has penned 10 books spanning various fields, including his own autobiography Glimpses of Greatness.

At 91, Rochford spends his days quietly with his wife Edlin, as well as having the fulfilment of his family and friends around. This, he says, keeps an active mind, which in turn keeps an active body. He admonishes retirees to do the same, always keeping themselves occupied.

As his earlier years, Rochford continues to valiantly trek forward. He's nowhere near letting up for he knows all too well that with living, many more glimpses of greatness can be accomplished.









UNRAVELLING THE ICY GRIP: FROZEN SHOULDER OCCURRENCE IN MENOPAUSE AND Appropriate TREATMENT STRATEGIES

Delaying and Reversing Frailty!



Eucalyptus has just celebrated another year, but no one remembered. He spends most of his time at home and sometimes goes a week without seeing people. He rarely talks to anyone, has lost contact with friends and spends most of his time watching television. Eucalyptus misses several meals because he does not have the energy to prepare them. For his birthday he felt very depressed and spent the day in bed hoping it to be his last.

Chamomile is in frequent touch with friends and family who surprised her with a birthday celebration. She walks with neighbours regularly, is a member of a 55+ social club taking part in exercise classes, nutrition workshops and social nights.

In the abovementioned, we see circumstances that are experienced by many. Nevertheless, a greater percentage of persons have similar experiences like in the first scenario. If Eucalyptus or Chamomile were to experience a fall or pneumonia, who do you think would likely get help? Chamomile would most likely get a ride to the doctor or a visit in the hospital. Several people will also check in on her and arrange assistance while she recovers. Eucalyptus, however, would be unlikely to get much help and more likely than Chamomile to fare poorly if his health became challenged. Eucalyptus has progressed to frailty and in the following aspects: nutritionally frail, physically frail, psychologically

frail and socially frail. Frailty can have multifaceted contributors, including physical, psychological, social and environmental elements. It increases the risks of illness, falls, dependency, disability, and death. Frailty increases with age and affects both the brain and the body leaving one vulnerable, both immediately and in the future.

Older people who are frail can have difficulty coping with minor illnesses and events, such as infections and constipation, and they can be more susceptible to side effects from certain medications. There are those who live healthy and active lifestyles, while others grow weaker, move slower and become less active over time.

Nutrition risk and malnutrition are prevalent in older adults

and contribute to the onset of frailty. They lead to difficulty with everyday tasks, higher risk for falls and fractures, weight loss and functional impairment or need for institutionalised care or hospitalisations.

Nutrition intake is associated with several frailty criteria, including low muscle strength, feelings of exhaustion, reduced physical activity and slow walking speed. Frailty, in turn, can reduce nutrition intake and have negative consequences for nutritional status. Tackling nutritional risk factors offers an opportunity in primary prevention of undernutrition, malnutrition and physical frailty. People who are physically frail have less physiological strength and a reduced biological ability to bounce back from illness or injury. There is loss of strength and endurance, exhaustion and reduced physical capacity. Self-neglect has also been linked to physical function, reduced nutritional intake and poor social support (social frailty).

"Frailty can have multifaceted contributors." Nutritional, physical frailty and

reduced function can certainly be accelerated by social frailty. The prevalence of social frailty among older adults is high. Social isolation and loneliness are contributors to developing frailty and reduced quality of life. Increased social support is associated with lower frailty. Socially frail older adults have a higher possibility of not eating three full meals a day which increases the risk of malnutrition. Timely preventative action would prevent frailty and progression/ deterioration. Recognising frailty early allows for enhanced care. The prevention, delay or amelioration of frailty should remain a top priority. Both pre-frail and frail seniors should get Registered Dietitian led nutritional guidance, perform various exercise activities that includes aerobic, resistance, balance, and flexibility activities, and be socially active.

RECIPE



AVOCADO SUSHI CAKE

Ingredients

- 375 ml (1¹/₂ cups) Sushi Rice: The base of the cake, providing a sticky and flavorful layer.
- 20 ml (4 tsp) Sugar: Balances the vinegar's acidity, enhancing the rice's taste.
- 45 ml (3 tbsp) Rice Vinegar: Gives the rice its characteristic sushi flavor.

- 5 ml (1 tsp) each Black and White Sesame Seeds: Decorative and flavorful topping.
- Extra Avocado to serve: Enhances presentation and adds more avocado goodness.
- 125 ml (¹/₂ cup) Soy Sauce: Serves as a savory dipping sauce.
- 60 ml (¼ cup) Finely Grated Fresh Ginger: Adds a spicy, aromatic kick to the sauce.

Instructions

- 1. Prepare the Sushi Rice: Follow the package instructions to soak, simmer, and steam the rice. Mix in a cooled vinegar and sugar solution for the perfect sushi rice texture.
- 2. Layering the Cake: Line your baking tin with paper and a nori sheet. Spread half the rice, followed by avocado slices and salmon, creating distinct layers.

Tips, Notes, Storing, and Reheating

- Tips: Enhance the flavor by serving with wasabi paste or pickled ginger. Experiment with different fillings like crab meat or cucumber for variety.
- Notes: If you're not a fan of raw fish, consider using smoked salmon or cooked shrimp as alternatives.
- Storing: Wrap the sushi cake tightly in cling film and refrigerate for up to 24 hours. Avoid freezing, as it can alter the texture of the ingredients.
- Reheating: Sushi cakes are best enjoyed cold. If you must warm it, do so gently, ensuring not to cook the raw ingredients.


